Moseley in Bloom open gardens

This is a special edition of the Thunderer for Moseley in Bloom.

This weekend sees the Moseley in Bloom Open Gardens, an opportunity to visit 30 gardens and thus to support the floral display in the village.



There are a number of 'loops' opening on different days. The St Agnes loop is on Saturday 16th June and includes the Billesley Lane Allotments Open Day. Here are some addresses, to get you started; the full list is available on the day or via the Moseley in Bloom website. 37 and 48 St Agnes Road, 21 Dyott road, 12 Southlands Rd.

The Chantry Rd and Augusta Rd loop will be open on Sunday 17th June and includes 52 (teas available), 54 and 45 Chantry Rd, 26, 34 and 38 Augusta Rd and also the Sage Community Garden (plant sale) and the Moseley Park and Pool Open Day.

Also on Sunday, the Reddings Road loop includes numbers 14,15,20,27 and 28 Reddings Road, amongst others.

The gardens will all be open from 1.30 until 6pm. A day ticket is £4 and a weekend ticket £6.

This would mean that the cumulative impact of the licensed trade in Moseley could be a factor when considering applications for new pubs or bars, for new off-licences, or for restaurants to be turned into bars. The group decided to keep a log of any incidents so that there is a true record of

any nuisance, noise, disturbance suffered by local residents as a result of the licensed trade. If you wish to report anything, you are asked to use a standard form, a copy of which is attached to this newsletter.
